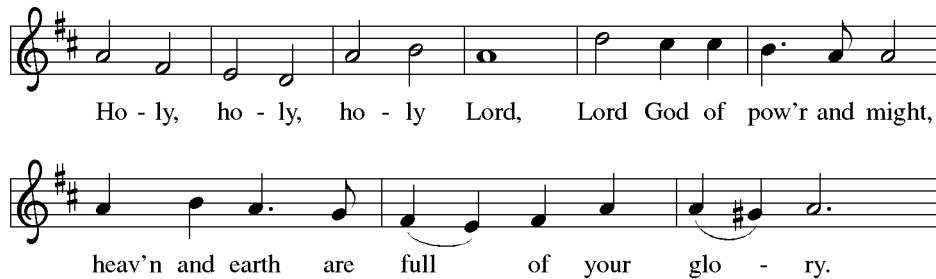

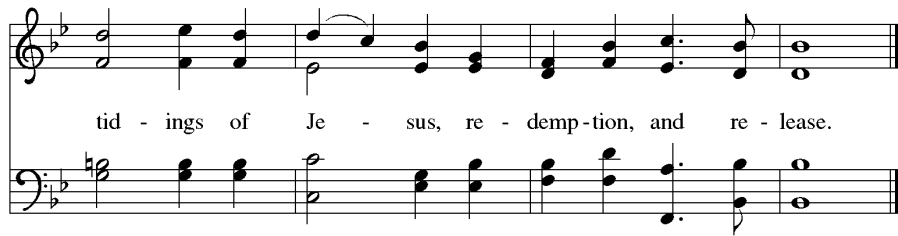

WHAT'S UP AT CUP?

In March 2026, CUP served 1,068 people with 9,612 meals provided. CUP registered 56 new households to us and 21 of those were new to any food pantry in our area. That is compared to last year when we registered 34 new households to CUP and only 12 of them were new to any food pantry in our area.
